We introduce them to major artistic movements and artefacts, and we teach them the vocabulary and knowledge they need to describe, to appreciate and to understand them. Alongside this, children become proficient in a range of fundamental artistic techniques, and they use this to produce creative artwork of their own, through which they can record or respond to experiences and issues, and explore their own ideas.
